After her husband joined the State Department in the early 1950's, they spent the next 16 years in postings in Iran, Iraq, Lebanon, Sudan and South Africa. For the next 25 years, she devoted herself to painting and teaching, displaying her work regularly at galleries and museums in S.C. and Washington, and winning numerous awards.

WWII had begun and Mr. Armstrong was looking for a model with a girl next door look that every GI dreamed of coming home to. Jewel had the look and the charm and Mr. Armstrong had the unique ability to convey it into a painting. Jewel's calendars were so successful that they were copied on WWII bombers as nose art. The government even enlisted her help in War Bond drives. Jewel became the daughter Mr. Armstrong never had and they continued to collaborate their talents long after the war had ended. Their association lasted nearly 20 years and over 50 calendars. Because calendars were the most popular form of visual advertising of the day, her image was printed countless millions of times. She was probably the number one pin-up girl of all time.

Jewel was preceded in death by her husband, parents, brother C.F. Flowers and sister, Evelyn Flowers. Jewel is survived by her son Woody Welch of Los Angeles, CA who was the joy of her life. A niece and a nephew; a great-niece and two great-nephews, and countless great-great-nieces and great-great-nephews. Jewel was a member of the Eastern Star and Senior Friends. She was also very active in numerous areas of service.
